Three days snowmobile tour

Discover the unique winter landscape of Swedish Lapland on a snowmobile. We take you right into the last wilderness of Europe and show you the untouched nature in the far north of Scandinavia. Experience crystal-clear air, snow-covered forests, frozen lakes and rivers, reindeer and moose in their natural habitat.

Tourplan

- Day 1** Upon arrival in Kiruna, we will pick you up and bring you to our camp near Jukkasjärvi. Your guide will provide you with winter clothing for the tour. In the evening there is a dinner in our cozy Kåta. Afterwards, the guide will inform you about the tour and explain the safety precautions.
For the overnight stay a 4-bed cabin is available in the camp.
- Day 2** After breakfast, you will be introduced to the handling of the snowmobile. At 10 o'clock we start the tour. We drive along the Torneälven, one of the longest rivers in Sweden, to our wilderness hut, where we spend the first night. Halfway we stop for a lunch break. The length of the stage is 50-75 km. After a dinner together there is enough time for a walk or a typical swedish sauna.
- Day 3** Todays tour brings us over 80-120 km to a bit more challenging terrain. Halfway we stop for a lunch break with an open fire. In a big loop we drive back to our hut.
- Day 4** After breakfast we start on a daytrip that brings us back to the Huskycamp. Distance covered 40-60 km.

Our tour leads us into the wilderness around Kiruna and Jukkasjärvi. We provide helmets, goggles, gloves, winter boots and overalls for this tour.

The tour can be extended by 1-2 days. The price for each additional night is 3000 SEK / person.

Participants of the tour must have a drivers license. The deductible in case of damage or destruction of the snowmobile is 7500 SEK.

Tundra tour

This tour leads up to the tundra in the border triangle Norway, Sweden and Finland. The distances on the second and third day are 100-150 km. The route length is always dependent on the weather and the local conditions (open and thus impassable rivers, snow drifts, etc.). This tour can also be extended.
